AMERICAS

☐ KVOH, Los Angeles

- ➤ Built in 1986
- Changed hands in 2002; closed in 2009
- Sold to Strategic Communications Group and re-opened November, 2013

☐ Currently broadcasts

- > 50 kW using an RCA transmitter and TCI log periodic antenna
- > 5+ hours daytime Mon-Fri in Spanish on 17775 kHz
- Evening broadcasts in English on 9975 kHz to resume in the near future

□ Future plans

- 100 kW transmitter, additional log periodic antenna
- Expand broadcast schedule to 18 hours per day
- > DRM in English for North America




AFRICA

- **☐** Voice of Hope Africa
 - Station originally built by Christian Vision to reach Zambia and Nigeria
 - Supplemented by an FM network, and eventually closed in 2012
 - Sold to Strategic Communications Group and re-opened in May, 2016
- ☐ Currently broadcasts
 - > 3-5 hours daily in English on 9680 kHz to Central & Southern Africa
 - Coverage to West Africa to begin soon
- **□** Future plans
 - Low power SW, with additional antenna, for Central Zambia
 - ➤ Evening broadcasts on 4965 kHz
 - Expand broadcast schedule to 21 hours per day







